



5 Days 4 Nights Macau – Hong Kong – Shenzhen & Zhuhai Tour

Day 1 Kuala Lumpur – Macau (No Meals)

Assemble at the airport for the great destination of exploring this magnificent tour and upon arrival to Macau you will be transfer to Hong Kong by Jetfoil and the hotel check-in which soon after you will be at your own leisure for the rest of the day, exploring the cultures and trends all around you with your own sweetest moments.

Day 2 Hong Kong – Shenzhen (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)

Another promising moment which you will have a privilege of a half day tour in the city of Hong Kong, which brings you to The Repulse Bay, In 1841, the bay was used as a base by pirates and caused serious concern to foreign [merchant ships](#) trading with [China](#). The pirates were subsequently repulsed by the [British Fleet](#); hence the name. Another theory holds that the bay was named after [HMS Repulse](#) which was stationed at the bay at one point. In the 1910s, Repulse Bay was developed into a beach, and the Repulse Bay Hotel was built in 1920. To attract swimmers, a bus route from [Central](#) to Repulse Bay was created, and now stands as one of Hong Kong's oldest bus routes. During the [Battle of Hong Kong](#) in [World War II](#), Repulse Bay was an important strategic location. Continuing to **Aberdeen** (pronounced /æbər'di:n) is an area on the south shore of [Hong Kong Island](#) in [Hong Kong](#). It is part of the [Southern District](#). **Aberdeen Harbor** is a harbor between Aberdeen and [Ap Lei Chau](#). Aberdeen traditionally includes the town of Aberdeen, [Wong Chuk Hang](#) and Ap Lei Chau, but it is sometimes used to refer to the town only. And traveling along will be the Mid Level of Victoria Peak & Bauhinia Sq with great scenery and ambience of Hong Kong's culture. With soon after the visitations you will be leaded to the most famous of its Jeweler Shops & Chinese Herb Shops where many traditional products are available all around you of its best jewel designing and nutrition's, plus group photo caption. The tour will lead you direct to Shenzhen check in.

Day 3 Shenzhen (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)

After enjoying your breakfast you will visit to The **China Folk Culture Village** (also called **ShenZhen Splendid China Folk Culture Village**, [深圳中国民俗文化村](#)) is a [theme park](#) in [Shenzhen, China](#). It is located adjacent to the [Splendid China](#) theme park and features displays of the daily life and architecture of China's [56 ethnic groups](#). It was opened to the public in October 1991. There you will enjoy the cultural show plus soon after do not miss out the shopping spree at the museum of mineral & Jade Factory. And to call up for the day in Shenzhen hotel.

Day 4 Shenzhen – Zhuhai (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)

After your meal of breakfast you will proceed to **Zhuhai** ([Chinese](#): 珠海; [pinyin](#): Zhūhǎi; lit. "Pearl Sea") is a [prefecture-level city](#) on the southern coast of [Guangdong province](#) in the [People's Republic of China](#). Located in the [Pöahl River Delta](#), Zhuhai borders [Jiangmen](#) to the northwest, [Zhongshan](#) to the north, and [Macau](#) to the south. Zhuhai was one of the original [Special Economic Zones](#) established in the 1980s. Zhuhai is also one of China's premier tourist destinations, being called the [Chinese Riviera](#). Zhuhai's attractive environment and surrounding landscapes help its reputation within China as a garden city and its quality of life. In 2002, the city attracted 1.3 million international tourists and 3.64 million domestic tourists. Following Guangzhou and [Shenzhen](#) in Guangdong province, Zhuhai has the largest amount of foreign tourism, which amounted to US\$0.5 billion in 2002.

Realizing the substantial benefits brought by [tourism](#), the local government is constantly improving the existing tourist spots and exploring new tourist resources. The local government is developing new tourist spots such as [Hengqin](#) (橫琴島), Dong'ao (東澳), Hebao (荷包), Qi'ao (淇澳島) and Yeli (野狸).

Day 5 Zhuhai – Macau – Kuala Lumpur (Breakfast / Lunch)

Breakfast for the start and you will be transfer back to Macau City Tour, the city of Ruins of St.Paul Cathedral, a destination of the history in Macau's famous religion spot. And you will tour the **A-Ma**

Temple ([traditional Chinese](#): 媽閣廟; [simplified Chinese](#): 妈阁庙 [Jyutping](#): Maa1 Gok3 Miu6; [pinyin](#): Mā Gé Miào; [Portuguese](#): *Templo de A-Má*), situated on the southwest tip of the [Macau Peninsula](#), is one of the oldest and most famous temples in [Macau](#). Built in 1488, the temple is dedicated to the goddess of seafarers and fishermen [Matsu](#). And proceed to the Governors' House on a coach view only. Continuing on to The **Macau Fisherman's Wharf** ([Portuguese](#): *Doca dos Pescadores*; [Chinese](#): 澳門漁人碼頭) is the first [theme park](#) in [Macau](#). It is located in the [Macau Peninsula](#), near the [Hong Kong-Macau Ferry Pier](#). The construction took 5 years, before an opening ceremony by the [Chief Executive of Macau](#) and trial operation began on December 31, 2005. After one year of trial operation, the wharf was officially opened on December 31, 2006, and to the Governor House.

And you will proceed back to the airport having the most satisfaction tour of the year with great memories of your lifetime.
