

6 Days Gold Coast / Movie World / Sea World / Tangalooma Resort

Day 1 Kuala Lumpur – Gold Coast Brisbane Australia

Assembling at the airport for the most fascinating journey of your lifetime in this spectacular Gold Coast Australia the fun filled event of the season.

Day 2 (Breakfast) – Sea World

Upon arrival at the Coolangatta Airport you will be led to the **Sea World**, is a [marine mammal park](#) on the [Gold Coast, Queensland, and Australia](#). It includes rides, animal exhibits and other attractions, and promotes conservation through education and through the rescue and rehabilitation of sick, injured or orphaned wildlife. Sea World was founded by Keith Williams in 1958. It was originally known as the Surfers Paradise Ski Gardens, which presented “*water ski shows that combined comedy, aqua ballet and action*”. In 1971, the Surfers Paradise Ski Gardens moved to land on the Spit. Major dredging works were required to build the new ski lake. A year later, the Surfers Paradise Ski Gardens became known as Sea World with the introduction of dolphins, marine displays, a replica of the Endeavour, a swimming pool, licensed restaurant and gift shop. Extra additions over the next decade included the purchasing of competitor marine park, Marine land, and the transfer of animals and exhibits to Sea World as well as the addition of more shops and food outlets.

Day 3 (Breakfast) - Tangalooma

Originally a [whaling](#) station, **Tangalooma** is a [resort](#) township on the west side of [Moreton Island in Queensland, Australia](#). It lies on [Moreton Bay](#) and is known for its accommodation, dolphin-feeding program, [sand dunes](#) and [wreck diving](#). [Swimming](#) is popular along the white [beaches](#). It has a population of over 300 and receives more than 3500 visitors every week as it is only about 70 minutes from [Brisbane](#) by express [catamaran](#). Moreton Island is 98% national park though there are other small townships there, [Bulwer](#), [Koorringal](#) and [Cowan](#). The adjacent waters are protected as a marine national park.

Day 4 (Breakfast) – Gold Coast

The Gold Coast is a city in the southeast corner of Queensland, Australia. It is the second most populous city in the state and the sixth most populous city in the country. It is also the most populous non-capital city in the country. Gold Coast City is known for its sunny subtropical climate, surfing beaches, waterways and canal systems, a skyline dominated by high-rise apartment buildings, a rainforest hinterland in the west of the city, nightlife and its tourist attractions.

Captain James Cook became the first European to note the region when he sailed along the coast on 16 May 1770 in the HM Bark Endeavour.

Captain Matthew Flinders, an explorer charting the continent north from the colony of New South Wales, sailed past in 1802. Escaped convicts from the Moreton Bay penal settlement hid in the region. The region remained largely uninhabited by Europeans until 1823 when explorer John Oxley landed at Mermaid Beach, which was named after his boat, a cutter named Mermaid.

The hinterland's red cedar supply attracted people to the area in the mid 1800s. The western suburb of Nerang was surveyed and established as a base for the industry. Later in 1875, Southport was surveyed and established and quickly grew a reputation as a secluded holiday destination for the upper class Brisbane residents.

In 1925, tourism to the area grew rapidly when Jim Cavill established the Surfers Paradise Hotel, which transformed to Circle on Cavill neighboring with Towers of Chevron Renaissance shopping mall and resort apartment complex. The population grew steadily to support the tourism industry and by the 1940s, real estate speculators and journalists were referring to the area as the "Gold Coast." The true origin of the name is still debatable. The name was officially applied to the area in 1958, when the local government area covering Southport and Coolangatta was renamed "Gold Coast", although the urban area and the local government area have never had the same boundaries.

During the 1970s, real-estate developers gained a dominant role in local politics, and high-rises began to dominate the area now known as Surfers Paradise and later in 1981 the airport was established.

Day 5 (Breakfast) – Movie World

After a full satisfaction of the Australian breakfast you will enjoy the Warner Bros. Movie World; is a popular movie related theme park on the Gold Coast in Australia. It is owned and operated by Village Road show since the take over from Time and is the only movie related park in Australia. It opened on June 3, 1991. The Park contains various movie-themed rides and attractions ranging from motion simulators to roller coasters and slow river rides. In addition, costumed character performers also patrol the park, allowing visitors the chance to take photos with them. These include Cat woman, Batman, Austin Powers, Marilyn Monroe, Shrek, Scooby Doo, The Mystery Inc. Gang and various Looney Tunes characters. Minor street shows including skits and singing performances are also present. The All-Star Parade showcases costumed characters alongside vehicles and movie-themed floats. There are a number of active film studios within the Movie World complex. House of Wax, the live-action Scooby Doo films, the 2003 Peter Pan film, Ghost Ship, The Condemned and Fortress are amongst the many films and television series produced at Warner Road show Studios, adjoining Warner Bros. Movie World.
